

Complete Course Objectives – Mindfulness Yoga Therapy Training in Eating Disorders Certificate Program

1. List the components and functions of the first chakra (root chakra) in relation to physical and emotional grounding and how it is integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.

11. Define the core elements included in a comprehensive yoga therapy assessment.
12. Conduct a yoga therapy assessment using structured observation and inquiry with a client.
13. List the components and functions of the third chakra (solar plexus chakra), their relation to personal power, and how it is integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
14. Explain the medical complications commonly resulting from eating disorders and their impact on the type of yoga therapy used in treatment.
15. Discuss the role and structure of dialectical behavior therapy (DBT) and how to integrate DBT with yoga therapy in the treatment of eating disorders.

16. Evaluate third chakra foods and how they relate to biological hunger and psychological barriers.
17. Define the key components for creating a yoga therapy treatment plan for eating disorders using the chakra system.
18. List the components and emotional themes of the fourth chakra (heart chakra) and how they are integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
19. Explain how to integrate yoga therapy into the different levels of care in treating eating disorders.
20. Discuss the use of Mindfulness-Based Cognitive Therapy (MBCT) in managing eating disorder symptoms and how to integrate MBCT with yoga therapy in the treatment of eating disorders.
21. Evaluate the role of fourth chakra foods in body respect and self-acceptance.
22. Define the implementation process for a yoga therapy treatment plan using the chakra system.
23. Develop a collaborative yoga therapy treatment plan with a client who has an eating disorder using the chakra system.
24. List the components of the fifth chakra (throat chakra), its relevance to communication and self-expression, and how it is integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
25. Interpret findings from research studies on outcomes in eating disorder treatment.
26. Discuss the principles and therapeutic application of acceptance and commitment therapy (ACT) for eating disorders and how to integrate ACT with yoga therapy in the treatment of eating disorders.
27. Assess fifth chakra foods in relation to communication and truth.
28. Determine clinical indicators that suggest a need for modification of the yoga therapy treatment plan.
29. Evaluate the progress of a client with an eating disorder using the established yoga treatment plan.
30. Formulate clinical impressions and observations based on client interaction during a yoga therapy session.

31. List the components of the sixth chakra (brow chakra) and their influence on insight, intuition, and how it is integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
32. Review ethical and practical considerations in running a yoga therapy business.
33. Discuss the principles and evidence supporting the “Parent in Charge” method for eating disorders and how to integrate this model into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
34. Plan and evaluate a group therapy lesson plan for clients with eating disorders, incorporating yoga-based principles.
35. Evaluate sixth chakra foods in relation to intuitive eating and cognitive reframing.
36. List the components of the seventh chakra (crown chakra) and its role in connection, spirituality, and how it is integrated into yoga therapy for eating disorders.
37. Discuss legal, ethical, and regulatory considerations in yoga therapy practice.
38. Construct a basic business plan for launching or expanding a yoga therapy practice in eating disorders.
39. Evaluate seventh chakra foods and the psychological concept of unconditional permission to eat.
40. Complete a structured self-reflection to increase empathy by exploring client experiences.

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
